

Ted Cornell: Ted Cornell began his studies at the world-renowned Juilliard School in New York City at the age of eight with a full scholarship and subsequently earned both the Bachelor and Master of Science Degrees. He has been honored by being selected to appear in the awards volume of "Outstanding Young Men of America." He is a concert pianist and organist, has recorded six albums, and has in publication several choral arrangements and two volumes of concert piano transcriptions. Ted has made numerous appearances on radio and television and has performed extensively in North America, Europe, the Orient, Australia, and New Zealand. For 30 years he conducted his own chorale organization in concerts throughout the United States and has taught Choral Arts at the King's College in New York. Ted shared in the music ministry of the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association for 42 years. In 1998, Ted and his family moved to Williamsburg, Virginia, where he assumed the position of Director of Music Ministries at the Williamsburg Community Chapel. In 2018, he retired from full-time music to enjoy life with five grandchildren. Ted continues his role as Minister of Worship Emeritus at the Chapel.

Branch Fields: Branch Fields, described by Opera America as "a bass of resonant richness," is a versatile performer engaged throughout North America and beyond in opera, musical theater, and concert. Branch earned his Master of Music degree at Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music, studying voice with the great Metropolitan Opera bass, Giorgio Tozzi. Branch was given the Cole and Kate Porter Memorial Scholarship while at I.U. He continued his studies with a coveted spot at the Academy of Vocal Arts in Philadelphia, a full scholarship institution, working with Met baritone Louis Quilico, and participating in summer opera programs in Rome, Chiari, and Lucca, Italy. In New York City, Branch was placed in the studio of bass specialist Armen Boyajian, teacher of Samuel Ramey, Paul Plishka, and Eric Owens, and soon won prizes in several vocal competitions. Branch went on to sing with Santa Fe Opera, New York City Opera, Boston Lyric Opera, Edmonton Opera, Michigan Opera Theatre, Utah Opera, and many other regional companies throughout the U.S. and Canada. In concert, Branch has performed with the Munich Philharmonic, National Symphony Orchestra, Santa Fe Symphony, MDR Leipzig, and the American Symphony Orchestra. Branch made his Broadway debut in South Pacific, understudying the role of Emile de Becque in the 2008 Lincoln Center Theater production. He has since been the Emile in seven productions throughout the U.S. and Canada. nominated for "Best Actor in a Musical" in Boston and in Richmond, Virginia. Branch resides in Williamsburg, Virginia, with his wife and three children.





Phaedra McNorton: Originally from Mobile, Alabama, Phaedra McNorton's performance career has spanned both classical and musical theater. Recently, Phaedra gave a concert at the Botanical Gardens in Lucca, Italy as part of the "Canto degli Alberi" summer concert series. She was a featured performer in the opening night gala for the National AARP Convention at Civic Opera House in Chicago and then again at Nellis Air Force Base in Las Vegas. Phaedra understudied Sylvia Rhyne in the role of Emma at Downtown Cabaret Theatre's production of Jekyll & Hyde.
